Connections for Abused Women and their Children (CAWC) doesn't just believe survivors of domestic violence – we believe in THEM. We are proud to be celebrating over 43 years of staying true to our mission, which is to end domestic violence.

In the last fiscal year, we served 738 adult survivors and 164 children, as well as provided training to over 6,000 professionals and community members. These services would not have been possible without the generosity of donors like you. With your support, CAWC will continue to serve those who need us the most.

In the past 44 years, we have expanded our programs and services. However, each year, the number of survivors and their children increases as we strive to provide help to each survivor and child who walk through our doors. Since 1983, HOW (Housing Opportunities from Women) has been a leader in permanent solutions to homelessness. Through prevention strategies, expanded, affordable, supportive housing, and individualized support services, we have helped thousands take back their lives. HOW operates under the Housing First Model, which ensures individuals experiencing homelessness are housed as quickly as possible, and then provided with tools for success and self-sufficiency. The individuals and families served by HOW have been exposed to trauma, poverty, and violence. Because of HOW's extensive services and one-on-one assistance model, all clients are provided the individualized support they need to thrive.

There are, and will continue to be, significant hardships for the vulnerable individuals and families HOW serves. And while their livelihoods and their health are at risk, HOW wants to make sure their housing is not. HOW's first priority is to keep its individuals and families housed and connected to vital resources during the COVID-19 pandemic. The best way to help ensure we are able to do so is by making a donation to our Client Stabilization Fund and engaging your network in HOW's work. In tandem with HOW housing, our support services have become a necessary lifeline for many individuals and families as we work to alleviate the pain and stress from the detrimental outcomes stemming from COVID-19. And despite their stories of job loss, not being able to see their doctors, and laundry list of growing worries, the current low rate of known infection within HOW's client population demonstrates the life-saving impact of being housed. KAN-WIN'S mission is to eradicate gender-based violence, including domestic violence and sexual assault, especially for women and children across Asian American communities and beyond through culturally competent services, community engagement, and advocacy. While many of us are seeking safety from COVID-19 in our homes, home is the least safe place for some survivors. Some survivors are being forced to isolate with their harm-doer; some are unable to leave the house to buy food and other essential supplies because they have small children with no one else to look after them; many have lost sources of income and face barriers due to language and immigration status. KAN WIN is working to help survivors of violence pay for things like food, supplies, transportation, utility bills, strollers and wheelchairs, and other necessities they would otherwise go without.
